# INTERNAL POLITICS STIRS THE CHICAGO WOMAN'S CLUB

## **Storm of Electioneering Said to Be Going On for Selection of New President of Organization.**

Beneath the placid surface which the Chicago Woman's club presents to the world, a storm of electioneering is going on. A new method of nominating candidates for the various offices, together with the refusal of Mrs. I.S. Blackwelder, the outgoing president, to run again, is said to be responsible largely for this condition of affairs.

The only candidate for the presidency who has been mentioned publicly is Mrs. George W. Plummer of Oak Park. That there is a well developed opposition to Mrs. Plummer's candidacy is known, but just who the "dark horses" are is a well guarded secret.
